Foreword

Carefully controlled use of TfL corporate colours is highly effective in communicating the strengths of our organisation. Consistent use of colour across journey planners, signage and livery, also helps guide passengers to their destinations.

This document gives guidance on all Transport for London's corporate colours, detailing those that are used on our transport modes and London Underground lines. The colours illustrated for each purpose are mandatory and must be matched accurately. The colour references cover print, digital and paint applications where applicable.

1 Colour systems

This document provides colour reference codes for several colour systems. These are briefly explained here, to help you choose the right colour system for your needs.



Pantone Colour Matching System (PMS)

The Pantone® Colour Matching System (PMS) is a colour space used to describe, match and reproduce our colours exactly in printed materials using ink mixed specifically for each colour.



CMYK colour

CMYK colour refers to cyan, magenta, yellow, and key (black) inks used in colour printing. Where four-colour printing is specified the CMYK colours should be used.



RGB colour

RGB colour is a light-based colour model used by the displays of devices such as computers, and tablets. When using our colours for display on screens and devices the RGB colour should be used.



Natural Colour System (NCS)

Natural Colour System (NCS) is a perceptual colour model. The NCS reference should be used when specifying our colours for paint.

2 Corporate colours

TfL has a set of corporate colours which are used across the business units, transport modes, safety signs and certain London Underground lines.

This section provides the colour references for all the TfL corporate colours.




3 Mode colours
