1 Summary

1.1 To inform the Committee of Programme and Project Authority granted by the Commissioner and the Chief Finance Officer in accordance with delegated authorities under TfL's Standing Orders.

2 Recommendation

2.1 The Committee is asked to note the paper.

3 Background

- 3.1 The Commissioner (and in his absence, the Chief Finance Officer) has delegated authority to approve Programme and Project Authority on programmes and projects up to a value of £50m that contain less than £25m of unbudgeted expenditure.
- 3.2 The Chief Finance Officer has delegated authority to approve Programme and Project Authority for programmes and projects under £25m that contain less than £10m of unbudgeted expenditure. Approval of authority for projects of less than £5m that contain less than £2m of unbudgeted expenditure is delegated to Chief Officers and is not reported here.

4 Programme and Project Approvals

- 4.1 To enable an appropriate level of governance, processes are in place for the authorisation, control and reporting of projects.
- 4.2 Programme and Project Authority will normally be granted by the Committee for all programmes and projects as part of the newly defined 20 sub-programmes. Where individual programmes or projects have a value in excess of £50m and have not already received full approval, requests will be submitted to the Committee for consideration. Those programmes and projects with an estimated final cost of £50m or below, which have been approved by the Commissioner or the Chief Finance Officer, will be reported to subsequent meetings of the Committee.
- 4.3 Where the main contract has not yet been awarded, the Estimated Final Cost (EFC) is not stated because it is commercially confidential.

Approvals by the Commissioner

4.4 Since the last meeting of the Committee on 8 March 2017, the Commissioner has approved Programme and Project Authority for eight programmes and projects. Further details are set out in Appendix 1.

Approvals by the Chief Finance Officer

4.5 Since the last meeting of the Committee on 8 March 2017, the Chief Finance Officer has approved Programme and Project Authority for four programmes and projects. Further details of these projects are set out in Appendix 2.
