1 Summary

- 1.1 This paper informs the Board of progress against actions agreed at previous meetings and the use of authority delegated by the Board to its Committees or exercised by Chairs of Committees since the last meeting of the Board. A brief summary is provided below, with further information provided in the summary reports from the relevant Committee elsewhere on the agenda for this meeting.
- 1.2 On 27 September 2017, the Finance Committee exercised the authority delegated by the Board on 19 September in relation to an extension of TfL's Revenue Collection Contract with Cubic and in relation to the acquisition of a company to support the proposed over site development at Southwark station.
- 1.3 On 2 October 2017, the Remuneration Committee exercised authority delegated by the Board on 19 September in relation to the reappointment of the Chair of the Board of Crossrail Limited.
- 1.4 On 13 October 2017, the Programmes and Investment Committee exercised the authority delegated by the Board on 19 September in relation to the acquisition of additional rolling stock for London Overground. The Committee also considered a paper on London Underground's Emergency Services Network but requested further information before a decision was taken.
- 1.5 On 30 October 2017, the Chair of the Programmes and Investment Committee exercised Chair's Action (in consultation with members of the Committee) regarding the authority delegated by the Board to take urgent action to approve authorities in relation to London Underground's Emergency Services Network. The exercise of Chair's Action will also be reported to the meeting of the Programmes and Investment Committee on 12 December 2017.
