

MOBILE APPARATUS LICENCE CONDITIONS

In order to carry out parking of equipment, remedial or maintenance work on the Transport for London Road Network (TLRN), the applicant desires to use 'Mobile Apparatus' (**Cherry Picker, Spider Crane, Mobile Tower, Mobile Elevated Works Platforms or Piling Rigs**) which when in use will impede the carriageway and / or footways from time to time.

The Licensor has agreed pursuant to [Section 174](#) and [Section 177](#) of the [Highways Act 1980](#) to grant a Licence for a period to the Licensee so as to permit the usage of the Mobile Apparatus subject to the conditions contained in this Licence.

IT IS AGREED THAT:

1. The Licensor grants to the Licensee the right to operate the Mobile Apparatus on the TLRN, which will from time to time impede the Traffic or Pedestrian flow to a greater or lesser extent.
2. The date of commencement of the operation of the License shall be the date the licence is issued (above)
3. The License is only valid for the locations to which the licence has been applied for
4. The rights granted to the Licensee shall be valid for up to three operational dates, with each operation lasting no more than 5 hours and there shall be no more than 3 months between the first and last date.
5. Any damage caused to the Highway through usage of the Mobile Apparatus must be remedied by the applicant to the satisfaction of the Licensor, within 3 working days of the event, or pay the Licensor's costs and expenses in doing so.
6. The Licensee will erect, maintain and dismantle the Apparatus strictly in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and to ensure compliance to the Highways Act 1980 during operation.
7. The Licensee will ensure that the Apparatus and every part thereof are maintained in good working order and condition as per the manufacturer's instructions.
8. The Licensee will ensure that the driver and all personnel connected with the operation of the Apparatus are competent and efficient and take all relevant safety precautions.
9. The Licensee shall operate the apparatus so as not to cause any unnecessary nuisance to the Licensor or users of the Highway and in particular shall ensure that the Apparatus is not left on the Highway at the end of each working day, (without express permission)
10. The Licensee shall obtain and maintain during the term of this Licence comprehensive insurance against all general and third party claims (placed with a major insurance company in an amount of not less than £5,000,000.00) and those referred to in Clause 6 of this Licence and on demand shall produce a copy of the full policies of such insurance together with receipt to the Licensor for the current premiums.
11. *The Licence is personal to the Licensee and shall not be transferable to any other persons or parties.*
12. The use of recording equipment, cameras, videos etc. by any users from the apparatus is prohibited, and must be applied for separately under the 'Licence to Film on the TLRN' procedure from TfL

IMPORTANT PLEASE READ: Please complete all sections of the application and sign the confirmation section on page 3. Can you also submit a cheque for £100 (**Payable to Transport for London**), which will entitle you to 3 operations - these will be agreed with TFL for a period within 3 months. The licence can only be used at the one site per application - deviation from this agreement will result in a fine. A TfL signed copy of the licence will be sent to the applicant on agreement by all stakeholders i.e. Buses, Police & TFL. Applicants are advised to plan their works well in advance, as although TfL aim to Issue the licence as soon as possible, the process can however take up to one calendar month. It is the applicants' responsibility for advising the Police, London Buses, London Borough Councils and other relevant stakeholders of their intentions. Information of contact details can be obtained from TFL.
